

Trouble shooting tips with the Town Clerk's Office and online options:

Straight vehicle renewal that does not have any changes, can be done online

- Go to Town Clerk's page link on town website home page, look for link to "online services", click on Ereg and follow instructions
- You will need to know your plate number and the last four digits of your VIN
- You can pay by ACH (pulling directly out of your account) or by credit card, both charge a fee
- If your renewal is expired more than 6 months, it may not be processed online. Contact the office.

If you have a new vehicle or need to transfer plates, you will need to contact the office.

- To transfer your registration to another vehicle, you will need your previous current registration. If you do not have that, you will have to purchase a duplicate @ \$18.
- You must have a state issued Title or a NH Title App from the dealership. All vehicles 2000 and newer must have a title.
- If the vehicle is 1999 and older a VIN verification is needed. (they can only be done by NH State Inspection authorized establishments or local HPD)
- Bill of sale and any other supporting documents

Dog Renewals can be done online as well

- Go to Town Clerk's page link on town website home, look for link to "online services", click on dog registration and follow instructions
- You will need the tag number from last year but will need to add the last current year in front of your tag number to process. For example, if the registration was 2020, you would put a 20 in front of the tag number. If the dog is not current on rabies, you will have to contact the office or scan a copy of the current rabies certificate to the town clerk's email. If you experience any other issues, contact the office.

Vital Records can also be don online as well
