

Trouble shooting tips with the Town Clerk's Office being closed to the public:

Straight vehicle renewal that does not have any changes, can be done online

- Go to Town Clerk's page on town website, look for Ereg on right side of page, follow instructions
- You will need to know your plate number and the last four digits of your VIN
- You can pay by ACH (pulling directly out of your account) or by credit card, both charge a fee
- If your renewal is expired but not over a year, you may have to mail your check as it may not process online. Contact the office.

If you have a new vehicle or need to transfer plates, you will need to contact the office.

- Scan all your documents to the Town Clerk's email, townclerk@haverhill-nh.com
- All titles will need to be scanned front and back
- VIN verifications (they can only be done by NH State Inspection authorized establishments; HPD is not doing them at present time)
- Bill of sale and any other supporting documents
- We will look them over to make sure they are correct and give you an estimate
- Once you have the estimate, you will need to mail **all** documents to the Town Clerk:

Dog Renewals can be done online as well

- Go to Town Clerk's page on town website, look for dog licensing on the right side of page, follow instructions
- You will need the tag number from last year but will need to add a 19 in front of your tag number to process. If the dog is not current on rabies, you will have to contact the office or scan a copy of the current rabies certificate to the town clerk's email. If you experience any other issues, contact the office.
